

Getting on the map

You have paid, and we have started your pin near the town you gave us when you signed up. Every step from here to it being live, starting with getting in.

Your pin does not go up by itself.

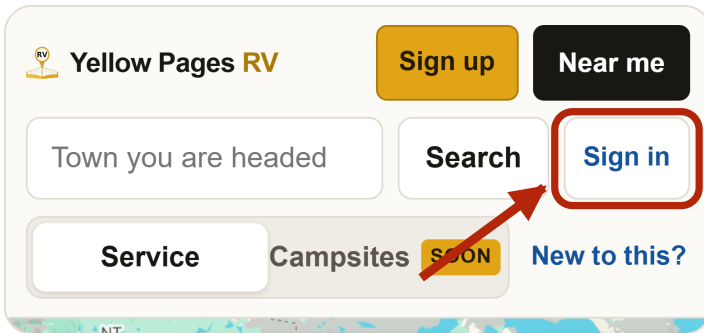
Paying buys the listing. You put it on the map yourself, with one switch, once you have looked it over. Nothing goes in front of owners until you do.

How long does it take? No time at all.

Switch the pin on and it is on the map within a minute. There is no approval and nobody to wait for.

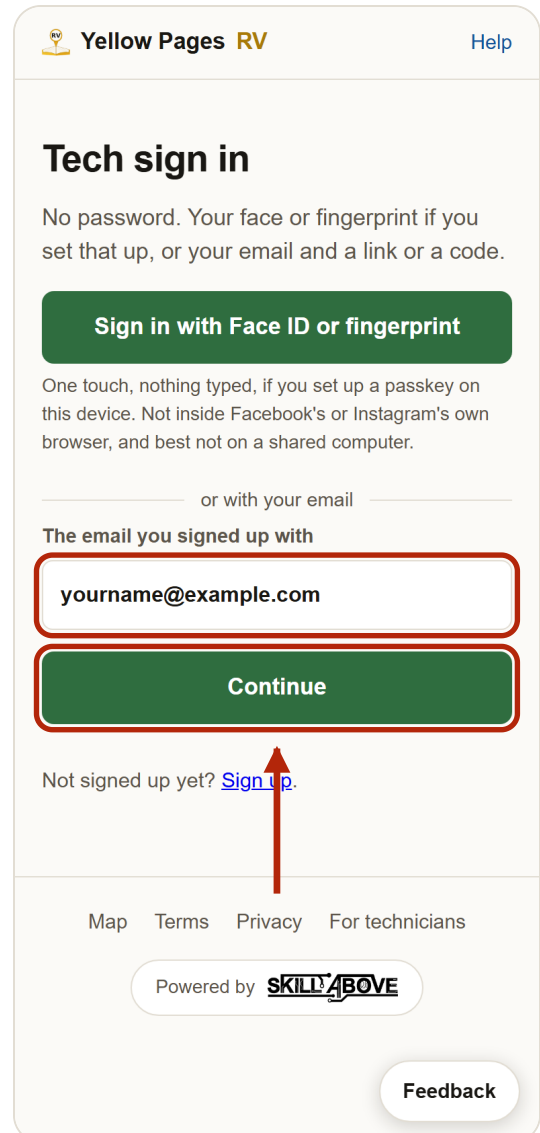
1 Go to yellowpagesrv.com and press Sign in.

It is at the top right of the map. There is no password, and nothing to remember except the email you signed up with.



2 Type the email you signed up with, then press Continue.

The same one your receipt came to. If you have set a passkey up on this device, press the green button above the box instead and you are straight in.



3 Pick a link or a code.

Email me a link if you will open the email on this same device. Email me a code if your email is on your phone and you are signing in on a computer.

4 Open the email.

It carries what you asked for: the code, or the link, never both. It works once and stops working after 30 minutes. If it does not appear in a minute, look in junk or spam.

Read it off your phone, type it on the screen you are signing in on. Then you are in.

Your email has a green Sign me in button instead of a code. Press it, and the page it opens asks for one more press, on that same device.

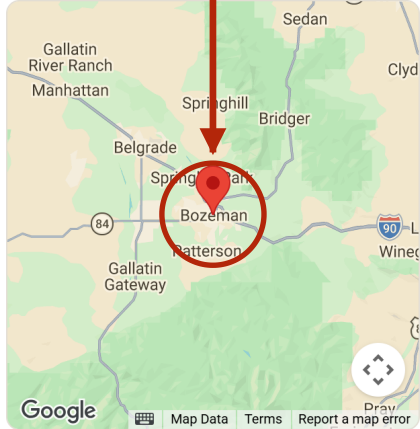
8 Drag the pin to exactly where you work from.

It already sits near the town you gave us at signup, and the card leads with

Place your pin first

. Drag it on the map to the exact spot, since your pin is where owners see you. To move it somewhere else entirely, type a different town or zip code in the box under the map and pick it from the list, and the pin jumps there. It goes where you are, not where you would like more work.

Place your pin first. We started it near Bozeman, MT. Drag it on the map to exactly where you work from, set how far you travel, and it is ready. The pin is your shop and the circle is how far your trucks go. One pin covers this. If a truck is permanently based somewhere far enough away that the circle would be misleading, that is when a second technician on the listing earns its keep.

9 Say how far you travel. Be honest with it.

Miles from your pin is right for nearly everyone. An owner broken down who calls because your circle said you cover them, and hears you cannot get there, has wasted their time and yours. If a circle promises the wrong thing, press

and tap out the boundary you actually cover. The next step shows when that is worth doing.

Be honest with this. An owner broken down on the roadside calls you because your circle said you cover them. If the answer is that you cannot get there for five hours, or you do not work that area, they have wasted their time and you have wasted yours. Set it to what you actually do.

Miles from your pin is right for nearly everyone.

[Draw the area on the map instead](#) if a circle promises the wrong thing: a mountain pass that makes thirty miles a two hour drive, or a state line you are not licensed across.

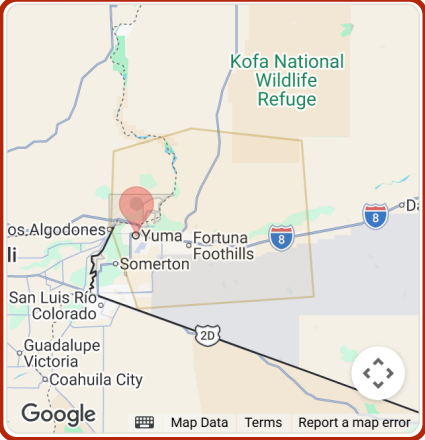

10 When to draw instead: a state line or a coast.

Say you work out of Yuma, AZ and hold an Arizona licence only. A 45 mile circle around Yuma reaches well into California, so owners across the river call you for work you cannot take. Draw the area instead and tap along the state line: the boundary stops at the river, and an owner in California is never sent your way. Owners see the shape you drew, not a circle. The same goes for a coast, where half a circle is water, or a mountain pass that makes thirty miles a two hour drive.

Type the town or your zip code and pick from the list, and the pin lands there. A zip drops the pin in the middle of the zip and names the nearest town, because a town name is what owners type. If the town is not there, pick the nearest one that is. The towns around it go on your page automatically, and anywhere two of your areas overlap we only list a town once.

11 Back at the top: switch your pin on.

The switch says Hide me on the map for now, and red means hidden. Press it so it goes off.

That is the moment owners can see you. The switch saves itself; Save changes keeps everything else you typed: the pin, the miles, and the rates below. It follows you down the page.

A pin with nothing behind it gets skipped

An owner with a broken slide has three listings open. Two say nothing about money or what they do. The one that says what it costs, what work it takes on, and who is behind it is the one that gets the call. Three more things, ten minutes.

13 Put your rates in.

Call out fee and labor per hour, in the Rates section. An empty box shows as "not listed", and owners read that as a gap. If you do not charge a call out fee, or you price by the job rather than by the hour, tick the box under it and your listing says so in those words.

Technician rates
Owners see these before they pick up the phone, and the listing that says what it costs is the one that gets called. A box left empty shows as "not listed", which owners read as a gap. If you do not charge one, tick the box under it and your listing says so in plain words instead.

In the box labelled Tell owners about yourself. What you do, how long you have done it, and what people call you for. Not an advert: write it the way you would say it to somebody at the next site over. Then tick the work you take on, in the Work section above it, because owners filter by it.

15 Press Save changes, then See my listing.

See my listing opens the map with your pin on it, exactly as an owner sees it. See my page opens your own page, the one to put on your website and your Facebook page.

? Stuck at the email, or still not showing?

If the email does not come, ask for another; nothing bad happens if you ask twice. If your email system will not let you press the link, the code gets round that. Once you are in, check the top of your profile. If it says Payment problem, your card did not go through and the switch will not put you up until it does. If it says anything else you do not understand, write to support@yellowpagesrv.com and a person will sort it.
